Safety Moment

Scouter Code of Conduct

Safety Moment Summary:

Did you know that the Rules and Regulations of the Boy Scouts of America support the establishment of codes of conduct?

General Information:

The Scouter Code of Conduct should be reviewed regularly; abiding by it is acknowledged by all adults when they complete an application. This code of conduct:

Provides a checklist of expectations for all adults involved in Scouting.

Emphasizes the need for all adults to follow the BSA's Youth Protection policies and guidelines.

Highlights the need for adult leaders to be familiar with the Guide to Safe Scouting and SAFE.

States that drivers will obey all laws and follow safe driving practices when transporting Scouts.

Sets expectations regarding the BSA Rules and Regulations, policies, and BSA-provided training.

Helps adults to model behaviors for all youth involved in BSA activities.

Emphasizes a leader's responsibility to notify the appropriate person(s) if a violation occurs.

On my honor, I promise to do my best to comply with this Boy Scouts of America Scouter Code of Conduct while serving in my capacity as an adult leader:

- 1. I have completed or will complete my registration with the Boy Scouts of America, answering all questions truthfully and honestly.
- 2. I will do my best to live up to the Scout Oath and Scout Law, obey all laws, and hold others in Scouting accountable to those standards. I will exercise sound judgment and demonstrate good leadership and use the Scouting program for its intended purpose consistent with the mission of the Boy Scouts of America.

3. I will make the protection of youth a personal priority. I will complete and remain current with Youth Protection training requirements. I will be familiar with and follow:

BSA Youth Protection policies and guidelines, including mandatory reporting: www.scouting.org/training/youth-protection/
The Guide to Safe Scouting: www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss

SAFE: www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/safe/

4. When transporting youth, I will obey all laws, comply with Youth Protection guidelines, and follow safe driving practices.

5. I will respect and abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Boy Scouts of America, BSA policies, and BSA-provided training, including but not limited to those relating to:

Unauthorized fundraising activities

Advocacy on social and political issues, including prohibited use of the BSA uniform and brand

Bullying, hazing, harassment, and unlawful discrimination of any kind

6. I will not discuss or engage in any form of sexual conduct while engaged in Scouting activities. I will refer youth with questions regarding these topics to talk to their parents or spiritual advisor.

7. I confirm that I have fully disclosed and will disclose in the future any of the following:

Any criminal suspicion, charges, or convictions of a crime or offense involving abuse, violence, sexual misconduct, or any misconduct involving minors or juveniles

Any investigation or court order involving domestic violence, child abuse, or similar matter

Any criminal charges or convictions for offenses involving controlled substances, driving while intoxicated, firearms, or dangerous weapons

8. I will not possess, distribute, transport, consume, or use any of the following items prohibited by law or in violation of any Scouting rules, regulations, and policies:

Alcoholic beverages or controlled substances, including marijuana Concealed or unconcealed firearms, fireworks, or explosives Pornography or materials containing words or images inconsistent with Scouting values

- 9. If I am taking prescription medications with the potential of impairing my functioning or judgment, I will not engage in activities that would put youth at risk, including driving or operating equipment.
- 10. I will take steps to prevent or report any violation of this code of conduct by others in connection with Scouting activities

Fostering diversity in the BSA through supporting Jewish Scouting

National Jewish Committee on Scouting (NJCOS)

- Founded in 1926
- Currently Structured in 4 regions (Northeast, Central, Western, and Southern)
- Provide support and training for Jewish Scout leaders
- Oversee Jewish Emblem Program (4 youth + 1 adult awards)
- Support local council Jewish Committees on Scouting (JCOS)

Challenges in recruiting Jewish Scouts

- No functioning Council Jewish Committee on Scouting
- Small Jewish population (1–2% of Council area population)
- No centralized Jewish Organization across Council
- Many area Jews have no affiliation with any Jewish Organization
- Most Scout Units Chartered by Churches (1 Jewish unit in Council)
- Many misconceptions about Scouting among Jewish population

Jewish Scouting History

- 1911: Mortimer Schiff early leader and financier of BSA
- 1913: First Jewish troop formed in New York City
- 1926: National Jewish Committee on Scouting formed
- 1928: Scouting for the Jewish Boy published by NJCOS
- 1931: Mortimer Schiff becomes 5th President of BSA
- 1945: First Jewish Emblem Awarded
- 1957: Over 1,300 Jewish Chartered units/over 100k Jewish Scouts

What can we do?

- Connect Jewish Scouters with Council JCOS/National JCOS
- Correct misconceptions of the BSA when recruiting Jewish youth
- Learn to welcome Jewish Scouts so they don't quit
- Promote Jewish Scouting activities such as Scout Shabbat
