For Cardinal District Commissioner strength:

24 out of 25 Commissioners entered a contact in Commissioner Tools. The district still needs a minimum of one additional ADC and six additional UCs to meet recommended staffing requirements. One new Roundtable Commissioner and one new Unit Commissioner were recruited this year.

Scott thanked the district for the opportunity for the honor and privilege to serve as District Commissioner for the past two years and introduced Patrick Sperlein as the in-coming Cardinal District Commissioner.

The Chair and the committee elected not to break out to operating committees but to proceed to reports from the operating committees.

Finance – Ken reported there were no fundraisers going on at this time of year. Tyler provided information on other council fundraisers and the Investment in Character fundraising campaign. William asked if the council had considered a disk golf fundraiser, considering the popularity of the sport. Tyler advised there was already a disk golf tournament at Camp Durant which was not well publicized, but that a local tournament might be a possibility. Ken suggested a virtual 5K run as a possible fundraiser. The discussion then turned to Camp Cards, which are usually sold from mid-March to mid-May. The question was asked whether the sales period could be longer and there was discussion concerning how to improve camp card sales. Gantt opined that the Council needed a better fundraising product than Trails End, and the members concurred. Tyler advised the reason the Council continued its relationship with Trails End was Trails End had a better app for sales. Tyler advised he would relate the opinions about Trails End at the professional staff meetings the following week.

Membership – Tyler discussed how much of the recruiting effort directed to schools would be directed to private and charter schools due to the lack of cooperation and access from the Wake County Public School System. The need to recruit at community events was discussed. Neil discussed the need to come up with a plan/calendar of recruiting efforts to help units better coordinate their efforts with the district.

Communications & Marketing — Gary Wilhelm explained that the district presently has three means of communication: the district website; email; and the district and district committee Facebook groups. None of those are really outward looking. Other media such as Instagram and TikTok were discussed. Order of the Arrow youth representative Trevor Rubino provided insight on how youth use social media and his own use of social media to promote Scouting. Tyler referred to earlier efforts by Robert Froom to make sure units appear on Google Maps, and Neil indicated he would work on getting remaining units visible.

Camping & Outdoor Program – Donna reported on the upcoming District Camporee in March 2023 at Camp Durant. The theme is Wild West. The event will be re-named as a District Camporee and Cuboree to comply with BSA requirements for Cub Scout participation. Chris Harmon will serve as program director the Cuboree. Members were reminded that Short Term Camp Administrator certification for most folks was expiring in 2023. If you do not re-new your certification before it expires (a four-hour course), you will have to take the entire eight-hour course again for certification. While Council was slated to hold a renewal session on 14 Jan 23, that may be re-scheduled. Renewal training is also available remotely from National with sessions in January, February and March 2023.

Order of the Arrow – For Netami chapter, Brian Lehrschall reported that the chapter holiday party had ninety Arrowmen in attendance. Brian also reminded everyone that the allowable time between election and ordeal is now down to 18 months. Trevor advised he was working to update information on troop representatives. For the Ilau Machque chapter, David Bernath advised it looked good for the coming year. The chapter hoped to do a better job of recording information for the Roth Award. Brian noted that Netami chapter had received the Roth Award and three Founders Award recipients were from Cardinal District. The OA Cub Scout weekend is coming up. Both chapters expect to make concerted efforts to integrate the girl Scouts BSA troops into the OA.

Chartered Organization Representatives – CORs of council-registered units must be a member of the district committee. By virtue of their positions, CORs are members of the district committee and the council board and should attend and participate in those meetings.

There was no old business.

There was no new business.

An open forum was held. A recommendation was made that we should be recognizing first-time attendees at roundtables to give folks an opportunity to get to know one another. There was also discussion as to how Occoneechee Council should be more welcoming to council-registered units and not treat them as a "necessary evil."

The District Director Tyler Perkinson offered his remarks. Tyler shared with the committee the new organizational chart for the professional staff in Occoneechee Council. Tyler's new title is "Field Director" overseeing Cardinal and Northstar Districts. Another district executive is expected to be hired this year to work in Cardinal District.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 12:30 pm. The next District Committee meeting is on March 16, 2023 unless Adult Recognitions are held during the March 2023 Roundtable. The District Committee would then meet next on February 16, 2023. A decision on that will be made shortly.
