Guide to Safe Scouting Update

Note: The Occoneechee Council will hold a Zoom meeting on Sunday, 12 March 2023 at 7:00 pm to review these changes with units. The link will be sent to Unit Key 3 members in the coming days.

Guide to Safe Scouting – Youth Protection and Adult Leadership

(Effective September 1, 2023) Two registered adult leaders 21 years of age or over are required at all Scouting activities, including all meetings. There must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. A registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over must be present for any activity involving female youth or female adult program participants.

Notwithstanding the minimum leader requirements, age and program-appropriate supervision must always be provided.

All adults staying overnight in connection with a Scouting activity must be currently registered in an adult fee required position as listed or as an adult program participant. Limited exception below for Cub Scout overnight Programs.

See [FAQ](#) for list of adult fee required positions. Registration as a Merit Badge Counselor does not meet this requirement.



Guide to Safe Scouting Update

Cub Scout Programs – Overnight Exception: Cub Scout parents or legal guardians taking part in an overnight Cub Scout program with their own child or legal ward are not required to register as leaders. All adults must review the “[How to Protect your Children from Child Abuse: A Parent’s Guide](#)” that can be found in the front of each Cub Scout Handbook. In addition, the parent or legal guardian must be accompanied by a registered leader at any time they are with youth members other than their own child/ward. All other overnight adults must be currently registered in an adult fee required position. (End Effective September 1, 2023 Update)

Safety Moment

Loading and Towing Trailers Safely



Safety Moment Summary:

Trailers used by Packs, Troops, Crews, and Ships are commonly used to two reasons: storage for unit equipment and to haul that equipment on trips and outings. Safe loading and towing of trailers can prevent accidents that lead to ruined trips



General Information:

- Loading: 60/40 rule – 60% of the weight should be loaded near the axel and towards the front of the trailer, and 40% of the weight should be behind the axel.
- Secure your gear – Unsecured equipment can shift during driving, even in enclosed trailers. Sudden shifts can cause a dangerous driving situation.
- Hooking the Trailer to the Vehicle – Ensure the trailer is securely hitched to the vehicle, safety chains are secured to the vehicle's trailer hitch, tires are inflated to the proper tire pressure and have sufficient tread, and that trailer lights are working properly.
- Driving with the Trailer – Reduce speed, leave extra distance in front of your vehicle, account for extra length of trailer when passing vehicles, slow down before going downhill, pull out farther before making turns to allow the trailer to turn, avoid sudden acceleration and braking, stop where you can pull forward when parking, and use chocks to secure the trailer when parked.

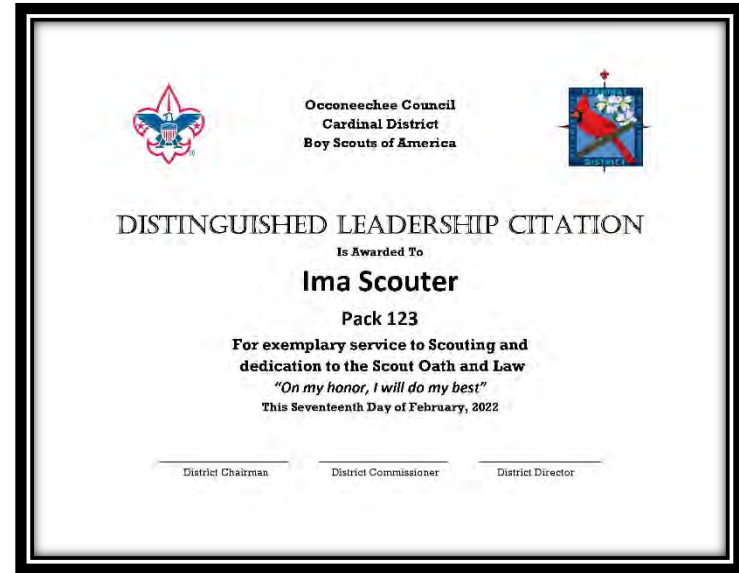
