### **Heat-Related Illness**



## **Safety Moment Summary:**

Each year, heat-related illnesses strike the unprepared. Prevention is key! Be prepared by acclimating to the environment for 3 to 5 days before going on an outdoor adventure; drinking plenty of fluids and eating a healthy diet beforehand; and continuing to drink fluids when outdoors on hot or humid days. Be sure to drink only when you're thirsty to avoid overhydrating. Take extra rest breaks, especially if you are exercising strenuously.



### **General Information:**

Four most common heat illnesses

- Heat Syncope
  - Dizziness or fainting that most commonly occurs when standing for long periods of time (such as flag ceremonies) or suddenly standing up.
  - Treat by moving the person to a cool area and drink water or diluted sports drink. If the person does not improve within an hour, seek medical attention.
- Heat Cramps
  - Sweating depletes the body's salts and fluids
  - Treat by moving the person to a cool area and drink water or diluted sports drink. If the person does not improve within an hour, seek medical attention.

### **General Information:**

Four most common heat illnesses

- Heat Exhaustion
  - Excessive loss of water through excessive sweating
  - Treat by removing the person from heat, remove excess clothing, spray the person with cold water or fan the person. Evacuate from the area if no improvement within 30 minutes.
- Heat Stroke
  - The body is no longer able to cool itself and immediate medical attention is needed.
  - While waiting for medical assistance, treat by moving the person to a cool, shaded area; remove excess clothing, spray or douse with cold water, place ice packs in the armpit, groin, and neck areas.

### **General Information:**

North Carolina is full of hiking opportunities for our scouts and leaders to enjoy. Some of these trails have the added benefit of providing education opportunities about the history of our State.

Certain trails also have opportunities for recognitions for our scouts. This includes trail medals and the BSA Historic Trails Award.



## **Historic Trails**

- Scouts can learn about sites of historical significance by:
  - Studying in advance about areas the sites to be visited
  - Planning routes from site to site
  - Answering questions put forward by the groups sponsoring the trail medals
- Some trails are age-appropriate for Cub Scouts, to include some urban hiking routes



## **BSA Historic Trails Award**

- Available to be earned by Packs, Troops, Crews, or Ships.
- Designed to help scouting units create or develop relationships with local historical societies.





### **BSA Historic Trails Award Requirements**

- Study information related to a BSA Historic Trail
- Hike or camp overnight on the trail or vicinity of the site
- Cooperate with an adult group to restore and mark all or part of the trail or site, or cooperate with such a group to stage a public event large enough to merit coverage by the local press.
- File Historic Trails Award application
