Safety Moment

Bunk Beds



Safety Moment Summary:

On average, 36,000 injuries related to bunk beds occur in the United States each year, according to Nationwide Children's Hospital and the American Academy of Pediatrics. The head and neck are most prone to injuries due to falls from bunk beds. Our Scouting family is not immune to this risk.

General Information:

What can be done to reduce the risk?

- Use guard rails on both sides of the top bunk. Gaps should be 3.5 inches or smaller to prevent strangulation. Guard rails should extend at least 5 inches above the top of the mattress on the top bunk.
- Verify that the foundation of the mattress is strong and that the mattress is the correct size. Are there any weight limitations?
- > Teach children how to safely climb the ladder.
- Children under age 6—or anyone with a history of sleepwalking or a fear of heights—should sleep on the lowest bed.

General Information:

- Roughhousing, bouncing, or playing on the top bunk or ladder is inappropriate.
- > It is preferable to place the bunk beds in the corner of the room away from ceiling fans.
- > Install a night light near the ladder.
- Ladders need to be securely fastened to the bunk beds.
- Objects such as belts, scarves, neckerchiefs, or ropes that could cause a hanging need to be stored away from the bed.
- Take the bunk out of service if the ladder or beds are broken, damaged, or missing.

General Information

Many sports and outdoor retailers sell bunk-bed cots, with and without side organizers. However, these cots usually do not have safety rails and even though they aren't as tall as home or dormitory bunk beds, injuries from falls can still happen.

Here are some safety tips for bunk-bed cots.

- If possible, install rigid safety rails on the long sides of the top bunk, at least 5 inches above the support rail. Note: This is required if the bottom of the top bunk is more than 30 inches from the floor.
- Review the manufacturer's guidelines for weight limits on the top and bottom bunks.
- > Teach all Scouts and adults how to safely get into and out of the top bunk. It is best to do this at the head or foot of the bunk. Never enter or exit the top bunk from the sides.
- Do not use the cot if the bunks are damaged.
- Do not enter or exit the bunk-bed cot at night without adequate lighting.
- Bunk beds and bunk-bed cots are especially useful in sleeping quarters where the amount of space is limited. However, make sure to follow the above safety practices to help prevent injuries.

BSA Religious Emblems Program

What is the BSA Religious Emblems Program?

The religious emblems programs are programs created by the various religious groups to encourage youth to grow stronger in their faith. The religious groups—not the Boy Scouts of America—have created the religious emblems programs themselves.

The Boy Scouts of America has approved of these programs and allows the recognition to be worn on the official uniform, but each religious organization develops and administers its own program.

How are Religious Emblems Earned?

For Youth: Each program has specific requirements that are to be completed. Some programs require mentors/counselors, and some allow for working within the Scout's family. The timeline for completion varies for each program.

For Adults: An outside party must nominate an adult to receive an award by submitting the required applications, letter of recommendation, and resume of activities. There is an approval process for adult nominations which varies by religious organization.

What does a Scout or Scouter receive when completing a religious emblems program?

- Cub Scout: Pin or a medal suspended from bar and Youth Religious Emblems knot (silver knot on purple background)
- Scouts BSA/Venturing/Sea Scouts: Medal suspended from a ribbon attached to a bar and Youth Religious Emblems knot (or Scouts BSA device if they already have the knot)
- Scouters: Medal suspended from a neck ribbon and Adult Religious Emblems knot (purple knot on silver background)



How can my unit do to help Scouts get started with their Religious Emblems?

- Find the program for the Scout's religion and age group (<u>https://www.scouting.org/awards/religious-awards/chart/</u>)
- Point the Scout to the resources needed (pamphlets, counselor manuals, etc) and have them follow the instructions for that program
- Encourage families to discuss the program with their religious leaders before beginning

Unit Religious Emblems Coordinator

- Unit Committee position responsible to acquaint youth with the religious emblems program for their faith
- Provides families and clergy with an orientation to the religious emblems program and encourages involvement
- Disseminates information about any local religious emblems programs, retreats, camps, or classes
- Coordinates establishment of goals and tracks the number of emblems earned each year.
